

On behalf of our City Council, staff and community, we're glad you're here. From sports to shopping – from arts and culture to destination dining – there are so many fun,

hip places to #SeeYourselfInFrisco.

Whether you're competing yourself or cheering for the team, Frisco scores points with sports enthusiasts of all ages. We're home to six "pro" teams that practice or play in state-of-the-art venues and inspired us to stake claim to the moniker, Sports City, U.S.A.

"America's Team" calls Frisco home. The Dallas Cowboys train at Ford Center at The Star. The state-of-the-art indoor stadium can convert into a concert venue or special event setting. It's surrounded by an entertainment district lined with patio and destination dining, specialty shops and even some history stops. The Ring of Honor Walk, a nod to legendary players, leads fans to Cowboys Plaza, where just about any day or night you'll find "kids of all ages" channeling their inner Staubach, Aikman or Prescott.

Don't stop there, catch a baseball game at Dr Pepper Ballpark, home of the Frisco RoughRiders, a Texas Rangers' AA affiliate. A short walk away, discover the Dr Pepper Arena, where you can see NHL's Dallas

Stars train. The arena is also home court for the Texas Legends, G-League for the Dallas Mavericks and home field for the Frisco Revolution, an arena football team.

If shopping is more your sport, there's more than nine million square feet of retail and restaurants anchored by Stonebriar Centre, IKEA and the Centre at Preston Ridge. Along the way, you'll find hotels and sculptures. Frisco's public art collection includes more than 150 pieces citywide. For more artful sights, head to Hall Park, home of the largest private collection of contemporary Texas sculptures ever made available to the public for free. For boutique shopping and dining, The Rail District is where you'll find food trucks, live music, unique shops and restaurants.

Art, shopping and sports aren't the only games in town! Check out the National Videogame Museum, featuring an interactive collection and an 80s arcade. Science and history buffs will enjoy Sci-Tech Discovery Center, Museum of the American Railroad, and the Frisco Heritage Museum. Next year, sports and history merge at the pitch when the National Soccer Hall of Fame opens its doors.

there's one thing Frisco is definitely good at, it's food. Between beloved local dining establishments and newcomers that are quickly becoming city favorites, Frisco is serving up some delectable options these days. (In fact, a July 2017 D Magazine article referred to Frisco as "the epicenter of the culinary world in North Texas.")

Newcomers to the Frisco dining scene include The Heritage Table, which opened on Main Street in Historic Downtown Frisco. The Heritage Table, a true "scratch-kitchen," opened in a converted Victorian

Wing Nutz prepares its wings – and other delicious foods – fresh, never deep fried and only made with high-quality ingredients. "Nothing on the menu is fried, we don't have a fryer in the restaurant," said David Parsley, owner of Wing Nutz. "Grease is for your car, not your body."

Wing Nutz's legendary crispy chicken wings, or bone-in or boneless pork "wings," are covered in its signature sauces.

"By custom seasoning, we can make your wings as hot as you can stand them. Personally, I believe love is gonna hurt sometimes, but food shouldn't," Parsley said.

This year, the city added The Star in Frisco to the mix, which is the 91-acre campus that serves as the Dallas Cowboys World Headquarters. The impressive venue not only houses the Cowboys' training and practice facilities, it also includes a hotel, shopping, office space and – of course – restaurants.

So far, the dining options available within The Star include offerings from Tupelo Honey Café, a casual eatery famous for fresh, scratch-made Southern fare featuring new twists on old Southern dishes and cocktails.

Neighborhood Services just opened adjacent to the lobby of the Omni Hotel, which is part of The Star complex, and serves seasonal, casual American cuisine. And, for the sweet-toothed folks, Cow Tipping Creamery is a must-visit ice cream shop that boasts not only classic soft serve ice cream but also Hong Kong-style bubble waffle cones and creative scratch-made variations of traditional ice cream toppings.

ART FOR EVERYONE

FRISCO'S ENTHUSIASM FOR OUTDOOR ART HAS CREATED A CITYWIDE GALLERY.

enjoying Frisco's parks and outdoor spaces will quickly notice the city's commitment to outdoor public art.

Frisco's collection of public art includes more than 60 pieces, one of the largest municipal collections in north Texas. These pieces range from artwork celebrating Frisco's history, nature and imagination to chipmunks eating Cheetos.

In fact, Frisco's commitment to public art is so strong it's supported by a city ordinance.

In 2002, the Frisco City Council established the city's Public Art Program by passing a Percent for Art Ordinance. This tool, used by public agencies, states and cities around the country, requires that a percentage of Capital Project Funds be used to install public artwork.

The ordinance also called for a development of a Public Art Master Plan that identifies guidelines for specific public art opportunities and supporting community programs. Frisco's Public Art Master Plan was approved in 2004. The Frisco City Council appoints a citizen Public Art Board to oversee the implementation of the Public Art Program.

The mission of Frisco's outdoor art program is to enhance Frisco's cultural and artistic vibrancy by providing contemporary art for the enjoyment of visitors and residents alike.

Now, you can learn more about some of Frisco's celebrated outdoor public art.

"Cattle Drive" is a public art installation and a tribute to a late 19th century cattle drive located in Central Park in Frisco. Visitors can enjoy life-sized bronze sculptures and murals about life on The Shawnee Trail, the first north-south cattle trail in Texas. This work was created by Anita Pauwels and winds its way throughout the eight-acre park. Central Park (3155 Parkwood Blvd.) is located in the heart of Frisco and is the perfect spot for those looking to enjoy a leisurely walk. The park was designed in the shape of a longhorn and has trails, a small pond, a running brook and an amphitheater. The park is filled with great spots for scenic or family photo opportunities.


"Chipmunks and Cheetos," which depicts, as you may have guessed, a chipmunk eating Cheetos, is located in Hummingbird Park (11605 Beeville Dr.). The piece was created by David Iles in 2009. Most of the elements in the sculpture were life cast from rocks and dead fall from the area. The chipmunks were modeled in clay. The neutral tones of the sculpture enhance the contrast of the neon-orange Cheetos.

"Cloudscape," one of the newer installations of public art in Frisco, was created by Joshua Wiener in 2016 and is located in a natural meadow on the southwest side of Harold Bacchus Community Park. The sculpture is based on a drawing of rain and depicts raindrops coming up from the ground and splashing on an imaginary ceiling. The effect creates a sense of containment and immersion. Harold Bacchus Community Park (13995 Main St.) features five youth-sized lighted baseball and softball fields, including the Rusty Greer-Texas Rangers Championship Field and The Mike Simpson Miracle League

"Fetching Water" was created by Janice Hart in 2009 and is located in the front of the George A. Purefoy Municipal Complex (6101 Frisco Square Blvd.). This bronze piece depicts a young woman drawing water from a pump and honors the contribution female settlers made to the area.

"For Want of a Nail" is located at the entrance at B.F. Phillips Community Park. This core-tin steel sculpture, which sits at the apex of the horseshoe-shaped drive, is just one of the many elements capturing the equestrian spirit of the park, named after the late rancher, B.F. Phillips Jr. The sculpture is accompanied by the words to "The Tail of the Horseshoe Nail," a nursery rhyme, inscribed in the walkway nearby. "For Want of a Nail" was created by Howard Meehan in 2008. B.F. Phillips Community Park (3335 Timber Ridge) is a popular spot for families and one of the newest parks in Frisco. Two phases of the ranch-themed park have been completed, with more additions planned for the future. The park includes soccer fields, a youth baseball and softball complex, concession stands, a picnic pavilion, restrooms, a playground and a dog park.

"Frisco First," created by David Allan Clark in 2009, features a life-sized 1900s-era



farmer holding on to the front of a train engine. The figure celebrates the arrival of the railroad to Frisco. "Frisco First" is located in the front of George A. Purefoy Municipal Complex (6101 Frisco Square Blvd.).

"Ghost Train & Mule in the Sky" was created by Tom Askman and Lea Anne Lake in 2008. These two gateway entry markers are located at the entrance to Frisco Heritage Village (6455 Paige St.) and reference bridge trestles, a nod to Frisco's railroad history.

"The Guardian" was created by Michelle O'Michael in 2008. The sculpture is located outside Fire Station #6 (3535 Eldorado Pkwy.) and is influenced by O'Michael's West Texas roots. The Guardian is a tribute to Frisco's firefighters.

"The Pitch" is located outside the front gate of Dr Pepper Ballpark (7300 Roughriders Trail). The sculpture is 12 feet tall and depicts a baseball pitcher in a post-release follow-through. It was created in 2010 by Gail Folwell and was selected for the 2010 National Art Museum of Sports Art Competition and Exhibition.

"Prairie Bells" was created in 2010 by Bill and Mary Buchen. The outdoor art installation commemorates each year since the founding of Frisco, from 1902 to 2010. The installation is located on the west side of the George A. Purefoy Municipal Center (6101 Frisco Square Blvd.).

"Slapped Pipes" was created in 2007 by Bill and Mary Buchen. The Buchens formed SonArc, a design firm specializing in interactive installations for children's museums, public sites and galleries throughout the United States in 1980. The installation, a stainless steel percussion instrument, is located in Tuscany Meadows Park (5611 Sims Way). Visitors can play "Slapped Pipes" by slapping the end of the open pipes which each feature a different tone.

"The Sky's the Limit" was created by David Hickman in 2007. This wind-activated kinetic sculpture is designed in the shape of a traditional diamond kite and represents dreaming of possibilities and extending one's imagination. The Sky's the Limit is located in Vivian Stark McCallum Park (9700 Snowberry Dr.).



"The Thin Red Line"

is located on a tower of Frisco Fire Station #5 (14300 Eldorado Pkwy.) and honors Frisco's firefighters. The ceramic relief sculpture depicts the figure of a firefighter with several faces above. The faces represent actual individuals living in the neighborhood of the fire station. The Thin



"Transparent Strength," designed by Damion Priour, was created in 2006. It serves as a memorial to Frisco police officers and includes an engraving of the late Patrolman Joe Preston Murphy on the polished glass. Priour (1949-2011) was considered one of the most successful Austin sculptors in his generation. The memorial is located

Red Line was created by Mario Echevarria and Chris McIntire in 2006.

"The Three Muses," located in front of the George A. Purefoy Municipal Complex (6101 Frisco Square Blvd.), was created by Michael Pavlovsky in 2009. The three figures represent railroading, agriculture and water; essential elements to prosperity and growth in Frisco.

in front of the Frisco Police Department (7200 Stonebrook Pkwy.).

"Zoetropes" is a stainless and painted steel sculpture created by Robin Brailsford in 2007. It's located in Harold Bacchus Community Park (13995 Main St.). Visitors can experience the zoetrope by adjusting the rate of the spin of the zoetrope's drum. Inside the drum, a series of images can be viewed through slots in the drum's shell. As the drum spins faster, guests see a smoother progression of images.

The Texas Sculpture Garden comprises more than 40 works of contemporary sculptures from artists around the state. The garden was created to benefit the Texas community by honoring the talent of local artists and making their work accessible to everyone. In fact, the garden has free admission.

The garden is the brainchild of Dallas developer Craig Hall, who made the garden an important component of Hall Park, a 162-acre office development. There are 150 works of art total on display in the Hall Park Art collection, including photography, glass art, paintings, sculptures, drawings and sketches. The

Texas Sculpture Garden is the largest private collection of contemporary Texas sculpture ever assembled and publicly displayed free of charge. The garden, which includes lakes, fountains and winding walking trails, is open to the public yearround and covers four acres. The backdrop of the sculpture garden was designed to complement the art.

Visitors can use restrooms and drinking fountains and pick up a map of the garden at 6801 Gaylord Parkway. The garden is open daily from dawn to dusk. Indoor venues are open weekdays from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The inaugural **DXL Frisco Bowl** will be held in its new home — right here in Frisco! — on Wednesday, **December 20, 2017**. The new Frisco Bowl, formerly the Miami Beach Bowl, is owned and operated by ESPN Events. The game is one of 14 NCAA bowl games owned by ESPN Events and is affiliated with the American Athletic Conference.




